FEDERATION TREASURER

Jenny Bailey

We are at the beginning of a new Membership year, and I would like to **remind WI committees of a few rules they are governed by.** All WIs



are charities as they come under the National Federation and as such must adhere to **Charity Commission regulations**, most importantly as regarding **Committee members (Trustees)** and those dealing with money. If the laws are not adhered to a **serious incident** may have to be reported by the Federation to the Charity Commission and we don't want that to happen to any of our WIs. WIs are also governed by the WI Constitution **so the following rules are very important.**

WI & Trustees: It is important all committee members understand that you are a Trustee of your WI you cannot financially benefit from the WI ie if you volunteer to be the meeting speaker you **cannot be paid** except for out-of-pocket expenses for which all **receipts must be provided. No-one connected to a Trustee of the WI can benefit financially.** To ensure valid use of funds and personally protect the Treasurer 3 signatories are required for all bank accounts and at least 2 signatures must be present on all cheques.

Funds: It is imperative that the income from subscriptions and fundraising activities are used to provide the objectives of the WI. Funds should be used to pay for hall rental, subscriptions, insurance, pooling of fares and expenses, speakers, educational activities, training, IFE fees, refreshments and ad hoc meeting expenses. Payments **MUST** not be paid to National Charities. **Payments MUST not be paid for members to dine at a local restaurant.** The WI may accept monetary gifts and financial donations to further the education of the membership. All records must be retained as the WI is a charity. All expenditure **MUST** be accompanied with receipts.

Membership Fees: Whatever your WI committee agree to charge for the WI part of the subscription for the year, must be the same for all members, existing or new ones.

Closure or Suspension: The Federation Board of Trustees must first give its approval for a WI to be closed or suspended. This must then be followed by a special meeting attended by a WI Adviser and a minimum of 25% of the membership who hold a secret ballot to agree the closure/suspension. There must be a 75% majority to pass the decision. If the decision is affirmative the Treasurer must settle outstanding bills; the members must submit a plan to the Federation Board of Trustees for approval detailing how any property will be maintained or disposed of. This does not include money or financial investments. If the Federation Board of Trustees disapproves, the matter will be transferred to the National Federation Board of Trustees, whose eventual decision will be final. With all outstanding bills paid the remaining funds are given to the Federation Board of Trustees to be held by them for 3 years. If within that timescale the WI is re-opened or a new WI is formed in that area the funds, minus any interest it may have earned, will be used to start that new WI. If the WI is neither re-opened nor a new one formed within those 3 years then the funds, inclusive of earned interest, become the property of the Federation Board of Trustees. SoS FOR HONEYBEES

One of the most popular recent WI campaigns

After many years of the WI campaigning on behalf of bees, we are all probably aware of the types of flowers to plant in the summer to ensure a plentiful supply of nectar and pollen for these precious insects, but which plants provide similar food sources during the winter? With climate change now being a reality, which plants can we grow in our gardens to feed the bees that venture out during the warmer spells in winter? This year I have spotted both honey bees and solitary bees buzzing around in our garden during January and February.

If you have space in your garden, why not try planting one or more of the following unusual shrubs to provide a valuable source of nutrition for our less sleepy bees on those warmer winter days.

Lonicera fragrantissima (**Winter Honeysuckle**) and *Chimonanthus praecox* (**Winter Sweet**) both have bare twigs covered in pale lemon/yellow, highly fragrant blossoms during January. Similarly, *Sarcococca* (**Christmas Box**) is covered in clusters of small white flowers throughout the winter and, as a bonus, then provides a feast of berries during the summer. Other useful and colourful shrubs include *Viburnum bodnatense* and various mahonias.

Even if you have only a small outdoor space there are many plants that can be grown in pots to provide useful winter feed for bees. Hellebores and heathers, together with a whole range of spring bulbs will provide masses of food for foraging insects early in the year. Not only will the flowers of these shrubs and smaller plants help bees and other insects to over-winter, but they will also lift your spirits with their colour and heady fragrance during the darker days of the year. Be bee friendly throughout the year!

WHERE'S WINNIE

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations 2 – 5 June 2022

To honour The Queen's longstanding relationship with the WI, and as President of Sandringham WI, Norfolk Federation, WI members are being asked to knit a corgi named **Winnie** and hide her in their local community as a fun surprise for others to find and keep. Members are encouraged to make as many Winnies as they wish and leave them in parks; on walking trails; in community centres, meeting halls or libraries; on bridges, benches or beaches... anywhere that can pay the WI love forward and cheer up someone's day. The lucky recipients will be able to log their find and a picture on an interactive map on the WI homepage, which will go live from 1 May.

Produced by the creator of Winnie; Hannah Joyce from Woolwich and Plumstead Roses WI, members of the public will also be encouraged to hunt for a very special version of **Winnie** which will be hidden in a secret location somewhere in England or Wales. A few notes to consider...

- **Winnie** has been created with sustainability in mind; members are encouraged to use up their yarn/fabric stash and other recycled materials to make their corgis. The patterns is available in *WI Life*.
- All corgis produced must have a tag, this can be attached to the corgi in any way. Makers can adapt the back of the tag to include a personal message or direct finders to their WI web or facebook page.
- Members are encouraged to be as creative as they wish, however if the pattern is adapted, including use of different colours wools, please ensure that the tag is securely attached so that finders can be sure they have found a **WI Winnie**.
- Please think ahead when planning where to hide your corgi; you may want to ensure the hiding place is well covered from the weather, or off the ground in case it's found by a fellow pooch - the more unusual and unexpected places the better!
- WIs are encouraged to think of ways to engage with the community and utilise this opportunity to promote the work of the WI and membership opportunities. Please consider those who may not be able to go out and 'seek' but may wish to be gifted a corgi; leaving a corgi on someone's doorstep can be a simple way of extending the hand of friendship and making others feel included and thought of.



This activity is open to all members of the WI; some may wish to knit; some may prefer to print and attach labels and others may be happier to hide the corgis; members are asked to work together and ensure that all feel included in this activity.

- Members are welcome to hunt for hidden corgis, including the special corgi (being produced by the creator, Hannah Joyce).
