an appeal was made for members who would like to help and a group of 8 members with needlework skills met up, based the initial design on the outline map of Nottinghamshire. A smaller map with a satin embroidered capital 'N' was then also appliqued on. The trunk and boughs of an oak tree were then embroidered on top as were leaves going from top to bottom depicting spring, summer, autumn and winter with acorns attached. As the banner was inspired by the ones made by the Groups, their group names were also added. The bottom of the banner has Nottinghamshire embroidered around the County badge with the Foresters' horn and ribbon.

This was all placed on the outer fabric with wadding and backing added, fabric hoops were sewn to the top so that a pole could be inserted, and a tassel added to the bottom. A stand also had to be made. The beautiful banner was made with skill and love and was first displayed at the 2004 Federation Meeting. We remember the great skill of the members and carpenter involved in this wonderful project.

The story of the project to make this textile began as an addition to the Millennium Group Banners which were instigated by the Agricultural

Show committee in 1999. As this was going to be a Federation Banner,

- 1. Arranging a stunt: there is Stunt Toolkit on MyWI.
- 2. Take part in citizen science: The WI has partnered with Freshwater Watch to offer WIs and members the opportunity to conduct citizen science in their local area. Between 20 and 22 September you can sign up to get a free water testing kit to check the condition of your local river. Testing is easy to conduct, and you can instantly upload your results to contribute to their National Report. Details also on MyWI.
- 3. Share NFWI social media graphics (let us know if you need a copy)
- **4. Craft a dragonfly keyring or River Goddess:** If you're feeling creative, why not check out NFWI Clean Rivers craft projects? The crochet dragonfly is a quick and fun project, perfect for the Week of River Action. It can be a great conversation starter or a small gift. Maybe you can use it to start a conversation with your MP?
