
good facelift for which we do not have the money, not even to give it a slap




CREATIVE ACTIVITIES Chair: Bev Stuart

Local Nature Survey

<u>Public Consultation on the Draft Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Nottinghamshire</u>

Local Nature Recovery Strategies (LNRSs) are a new Englandwide system of spatial strategies. The main purpose of these strategies is to help reverse the ongoing decline of nature in England by establishing priorities for nature recovery and identify locations to create or improve habitat most likely to provide the greatest benefit for nature and the wider environment. The LNRS will also inform the delivery of Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) and help to guide local planning policy for nature recovery.

Nottinghamshire County Council is leading on the development of the LNRS for the whole county of Nottinghamshire, including the City of Nottingham. The County Council has worked closely with a wide variety of stakeholders including farmers and landowners, environmental and conservation organisations and groups, as well as the 7 District and Borough Councils, Nottingham City Council, East Midlands Combined County Authority and Natural England to help develop the strategy.

The Draft Nottinghamshire and Nottingham LNRS will be going out to Public Consultation for 6 weeks between the 6th of May and the 16th of June 2025. During this period, the County Council will be holding in-person and online events which will be advertised on their website, to raise awareness about the LNRS.
