

HORNBLOWER 'BUSY BEES'

Every month four bees fly into the County Office and their flight is timed to perfection (no air traffic control to worry about!) I am talking about the members

from **Dorewood WI** who volunteer to pack the Federation newsletter "The Hornblower" and the enclosures – usually team events organised for members or documents for your WI. They fly to the River Room and then get to work like busy bees buzzing around, all have a specific job to do.



They collate the enclosures or put them into folders or count and pack the printed Hornblower copies into envelopes, before then moving to the postage machine in the Secretary's office. The envelopes ready labelled for posting by the office are weighed, the amount of postage recorded and put into a Royal Mail bag ready for taking to the depot at Newark. This all takes them about 2 hours to do – just in time to then fly off for a fish and chip lunch! What would we do without them? They are truly a wonderful

WI INDEPENDANT FINANCIAL

Our Constitution requires all WIs to have their books independently examined. The Charity Commission recommends it is done by someone competent who has no connection with the Charity Trustees (Committee) and they have approved the scheme run by the Federation. We have trained members

to independently examine WI
Accounts with a turnover of
less than £10,000. They are
trained to understand the
requirements needed by the
Charity Commission. EVEN IF
YOUR WI ALREADY USES THIS
SCHEME you do need to re-apply



to County Office, Trent Bridge House, on an **ANNUAL** basis following your Annual Meeting. An **IFE request form** is included in your **WI Annual documents** that we send to you, **please make sure the request form is passed to your WI Treasurer**. The IFE request form should be received at **County Office at least 3 months prior to your year-end date**. County Office allocates of an IFE who needs time to schedule her work load. All our IFEs are volunteers. They are spread around the Federation and if possible, we try to appoint someone within a reasonable distance. Treasurers should ask for members' approval to appoint a **Federation Independent Financial Examiner (IFE)** at WI Annual Meetings, you do not need to NAME the person. **Treasurers please note**; The services of an IFE is at a basic cost of £15. If they have to undertake further work to balance your books they are entitled to charge more.



Don't forget to renew your membership of the 50/50 Club, it begins again after November 1. Tickets can only be purchased in an individual's name (not a WI name) and for persons over the age of 18. An Application Form is with your secretary or you can download a copy

from the Federation website and payment can be made by BACS. It's not an exclusive club! **Please join it TODAY!**
