

#### COUNTY HOUSE CHICKEN RECIPE

An easy chicken dish which was served at County House lunches and was published in the **Federation Favourites recipe book**, celebrating the Federation Centenary in 2017/18.

2 tbsp olive oil

1 onion, finely chopped

4 chicken breasts

1lb 8oz/675g new potatoes, halved if large

8 oz/225g carrots, sliced

1 bay leaf

10fl oz/300ml chicken stock

6oz/175g pack sugar snap peas

8oz/225g asparagus, sliced

Juice of 1 lemon

Handful of tarragon, chopped

6fl.oz/175ml carton crème fraiche



**Method** - Heat oil in a large pan, add the onion & chicken breasts. Cook for 5 mins, until the chicken starts to brown. Add the potatoes, carrots and bay leaf and fry for 3 mins, stirring to prevent the chicken from sticking. Pour over the stock & then season. Bring to the boil, then cover and simmer for 20 mins, until the potatoes and chicken are cooked. Add the sugar snap peas & asparagus, then cook for a further 3 mins. Remove the bay leaf and stir in the lemon juice, tarragon & crème fraiche. Check the seasoning and then serve.
