

Chair's Letter

Welcome to September everyone! The month of change from Summer to Autumn, I love the Autumn with all the rich colours we see in our gardens and all around us, the leaves are starting to change from shades of green to shades of red, brown, and ochre.

As was mentioned last month Heather, who has been working in our office for nearly 20 years, has now left us and I would like to thank her for all her amazing work and wish her much happiness in her future.

I have been talking to you about all the little changes that have been happening within your Federation office, but now I would like to tell you about a bigger change that will be happening in October when we will be leaving Trent Bridge House. The house has served us well for many years but, as you know, was sold earlier in the year as it was no longer suitable for our needs and we could not meet the ever-increasing costs to maintain it.



Firstly, I will tell you that the funds from the sale of the Trent Bridge House will be safely invested and the return on this will go towards the running of the Federation. So, you don't need to worry that our funds are being eaten into, the money will still be there if we decide, should anything become available, that it would be prudent to buy a property instead.

What will this mean for the WIs and members? We will still be working for you as now, providing office support; Sue will be working from home, and all the trustees will be working as usual to maintain finance, compliance and the overall running of the Federation. All the events will run as usual, and you will still be able to book them via Trybooking.com and via postal/email application with, preferably, BACS payments, or by sending a cheque. You will still be able to contact us as usual; our email addresses will remain the same. By telephone: a new number, if necessary, will be advised very soon. By post: a PO Box address will be advised very soon and any post arriving at Trent Bridge House will be sent on.

We will be using a storage facility for Federation chattels, which also offers free meeting facilities for all our Team meetings.

So, from your point of view little will have changed but all these changes will make a significant reduction in the Federations outgoings, avoiding shortfalls at year end. WI WEEK OF RIVER ACTION 29 SEPTEMBER - 5 OCTOBER

In July, **Blidworth and Rainworth WI** welcomed John Roughton, Community Trainer from EMAS who provided free training on the use of defibrillators and CPR procedure. This was in response to National's campaign '**Bystanders can be lifesavers**'. Leaflets - "The Law and saving lives out of hospitals" and "Lifesaving reminders" were also provided. They offered this out to the community, and they welcomed ladies from the group Women for Women. A donation was made to **Teddies for Loving Care**.

On a summer evening in July **Kimberley WI** members and guests enjoyed a private guided tour of **Bennerley Viaduct** on the Notts/ Derby's border. Only one of two such remaining viaducts in the country and now a historic listed structure.



Wollaton WI celebrated 110 years of the WI by having a picnic in August at Wollaton Park (where else) members enjoyed quizzes and had a couple bottles of Prosecco to celebrate together! It was a celebration of friendship, community, learning and laughter, inspiring women who came before them -- and those who carry that legacy today. What better way to celebrate that spirit than with food, laughter, stories and sunshine. They also had a new member join them called Troublesome Deer (yes one of the park deer) who was after a very nice box of chocolate biscuits!



This year, in January, Watnall WI members enjoyed an interesting talk from one of the volunteers at AquaBox, a charitable organisation dedicated to ensuring safe drinking water and humanitarian aid is sent to people affected by natural disasters, extreme weather, and conflicts. Funded by donations, teams of volunteers manufacture, assemble, test and pack the family filters. Their outing in July took them to the Depot for an educational morning where members delivered towels, which are included in the aid boxes. These are good packing material and can then be used as towels again when they arrive. They were given a warm welcome, a demonstration on how the filters work and a tour of the workshop seeing how the volunteers work as a team assembling the various parts of the filters. AquaBox pack an amazing number of items into the Aid boxes including the family water filter, shelter materials and tools, cooking utensils, personal hygiene items and educational items and toys.

Members of Worksop Wonders WI were very lucky, they had a

lovely sunny afternoon for their "Tea in the Garden" event enjoying the cake and company.

Memories From Hornblower Editors

When I asked two former editors, Jenny Holmes, and Ellie Briggs how they best remembered their time as editors, they immediately replied, "I loved it." Jenny Holmes, Editor from 1987 - 1990 and again from 1992 – 1995 (she was Federation Treasurer in between!) did it pre-computers and had to type up all the copy. The Rural Community Council also asked her to help judge parish magazines & newsletters for an annual competition. Ellie, Editor from 1995 - 2001 tried hard to get WIs to take a copy for every member and conducted a survey of members' likes and dislikes. She loved knowing what was happening in the Federation and the hardest part was meeting deadlines! And having to choose your holidays around them! And my memories (Jenny Bailey 2001 - 2025) of the last two decades are really very similar - I have loved it too!
