UK Water Blitz as part of the WI Clean Rivers campaign. Four sites were visited, three on the River Trent, above and below a sewage outlet, protective gloves donned and samples effectively taken using a jam jar on twine and milk bottle bound to a bamboo cane! The amount of phosphates
