

Chair's Letter

As you are aware by now, the Annual Federation Meeting planned for the end of this month has had to be rescheduled. "Why? What has happened?", you ask. A misunderstanding on all sides meant that the Annual Accounts were not ready. As you have to do, in your WIs, we also have to annually report on what we have done over the year in the Annual Trustees Report [TAR], present our finances and propose who will audit the following year's accounts. Delegates – preferably from every one of our WIs - can then question statements made and use their vote to accept the reports. Annual Meetings have to take place no later than 15 months after the last one so we will now hold the Federation Annual Meeting on 14 June and the accounts and reports will be on-line for scrutiny 6 weeks prior to the meeting. This unexpected glitch has had a knock-on effect. Trustees will now have to stay in post until the June's Annual Meeting.

However, this does mean that there is still time for YOU to attend a Trustees Meeting to see if you would like to join the Board. Last year I mentioned that we are on the borderline for insufficient Trustees to continue as a Federation, unfortunately the situation is worse this year, so we really do need YOU. Another effect is that what was planned for June may also have to be rearranged or modified. Overall, it's not bad news, just something to deal with. I hope to have good news about County House next month. The sale is moving along nicely at present but there is still fluidity and decisions to make. Thank you for your understanding and

With the membership subscription fees due in April, **WI MCS** reps will need to take the time to update their members' register. Please remember these points:


- Add new member details so that they receive WI Life.




off at KMH community hub or brought to the Annual Federation Meeting on 14 June.
