Chair's Letter



INDEPENDANT FINANCIAL

Our Constitution requires all WIs to have their books independently examined. The Charity Commission recommends it is done by someone competent who has no connection with the Charity Trustees (Committee), and they have approved the scheme run by the Federation. We have trained members to independently examine WI Accounts with a turnover of less than £10,000. They are trained to understand the requirements needed by the Charity Commission. EVEN IF YOUR WI ALREADY USES THIS SCHEME you do need to re-apply to County Office, on an ANNUAL basis following your Annual Meeting. An IFE request form is included in your WI Annual documents that we send to you, please make sure the request form is passed to your WI Treasurer. The IFE request form should be received at County Office at least 3 months prior to your year-end date. County Office allocates an IFE who needs time to schedule her workload. All our IFEs are volunteers. They are spread around the Federation and if possible, we try to appoint someone within a reasonable distance of the WI. Treasurers should ask for members' approval to appoint a Federation Independent Financial Examiner (IFE) at WI Annual Meetings, you do not need to NAME the person. Treasurers please note: The services of an IFE is at a basic cost of £15. If they have to undertake further work to balance your books they are entitled to charge more.

FEDERATION PRINTED ARCHIVE

Over the past year photographs of the **Federation textile archives** have been published on the front cover of the Hornblower. The **Wall hanging** of embroidered tiles made by WIs to commemorate the 70th Anniversary has been very rarely seen. The **Federation Banner** is seen every year at the Annual Meeting, but, for those

members not able to attend, the photograph gave them a chance to see it. Another textile was a **tea towel** made to commemorate the



purchase of **County House in 1975**. The tea towel would have been well used and seen in many homes in Nottinghamshire. One, or rather five, textiles that have not been on the front are the **Centenary pennants** made in 2017; they were made into the five lengths of Centenary Bunting - they were a bit difficult to photograph!

For the front cover of this, the last printed edition, I decided to have photographs of the Federation printed archives. The three recipe books are used in many WI homes. Nottinghamshire Taste was published in 1977 for the 60th anniversary. Federation Apple Recipes, 2009 was published with recipes devised by the WI for Apple Day. Federation Favourites was published for the Federation Centenary in 2017 using many of the recipes that were served at lunches, catered for by the Federation. For the Federation Centenary Photograph book WIs each had a page and contributed 3 photographs and written text. The History of the Federation 1917 – 1987 is a very comprehensive history from our early years. The Hornblower's 40th Anniversary edition in 2011 and finally a Christmas card 2020, produced during the Covid Pandemic by the Federation; copies were sent out to every WI to distribute to every member. We also printed a Yearbook every year until 2020 and that it is now available on Notts WI SharePoint.

RECIPE

NEWARK SHOW CUT & BUTTER CAKE

This Recipe was devised by the Federation for serving in the WI Marquee at the Notts County Show and taken from the Federation recipe book, 'The Nottinghamshire Taste' and is very easy to make!

- 1 1/2 lb mixed dried fruit
- 4 oz Margarine
- 8 oz soft brown sugar
- 34 pint boiling water 1 Egg
- 1 lb S. R. Flour



Put the fruit, margarine and sugar into a bowl. Pour on the boiling water and leave to stand overnight. Beat the egg and add to the mixture. Sieve in the flour and a pinch of salt. Bake in 2 lb loaf tins, which have been greased, at 350 F, 180 C, Gas 4, for approx. 1 ½ hrs. This quantity will make 2 cakes.
